Reflection

We might note the powerful statement of Jesus to the woman in today's Gospel. It is delivered quietly, when she is left along with Jesus after all her accusers have drifted away: "Neither do I condemn you. Go away, and don't sin any more". We notice that Jesus doesn't ask her about the claims of her accusers. He does not condemn or criticise her. Instead he accepts her, loves her, treats her with the respect and dignity that was so lacking in the mob, and gently nudges her forward into a new way of living.
