SOME THOUGHTS ON CHRISTIAN LIVING

One line in today's Gospel might puzzle some people. "In the Resurrection of the dead, they do not marry because they can no longer die". We can look at marriage from two angles. The question about the Resurrection and Marriage which the Sadducees raise looks at marriage as necessary for the procreation of life for the survival of the species. But if those in heaven do not die, then the survival of the species will not long require marriage. However, a second purpose of marriage is the union of two people in love. Surely, the love of people in this life will continue more gloriously in Heaven. In the celebration of the Sacrament of marriage, there is a prayer that the couple will have long and happy days together and be united forever in the Kingdom of Glory. It is something to look forward to, being united once more with family, and with the previous generations.
