It is surely a sign that we have a deep interest in the future of the Church in our parish and in the wider world. Our conversations have ended, and we are now putting together the results of our conversations with a view to presenting them shortly to the Pastoral Deanery. We greatly encourage anyone who may have his/her own suggestion to send it to the Office email within the next week and we will bring it to the deanery, together with our parish submission.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER: This year, it is the turn of our parish to host the ecumenical World Day of Prayer in our parish. It will take place on Friday next, March 4th at 2.30pm in St. Augustine's. Using the Bible text from Jeremiah, 'I have plans for you', the special focus this year will be on some of the issues we are facing today – poverty, domestic abuse and disability, finding hope in difficult situations, and encouragement in the help we can give one another. We hope that many Parishioners will be able to attend.

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Today's Gospel warns us against the temptation to be judgmental — 'why do you observe the splinter in the eye of your brother or sister and never notice the plank in your own. Take the plank out of your own eye first and then you will see clearly enough to take out the splinter that is in your brother's eye'. This warning against hasty judgment of others may seem to be just common sense. However, it is far from easy to follow it in practice. Indeed, very often, common sense is not at all that common!

The Greek philosopher Socrates tells us that self-knowledge is the beginning of wisdom. Few of us are truly wise in this respect. We're so focused on the faults of others that we have little time or energy for the most important exercise of all - truly looking at ourselves and correcting our own faults. In today's Gospel Jesus challenges us to put our own house in order before trying to reform others. This is surely an appropriate invitation for all of us as we are about to begin the Holy Season of Lent.

Lent begins this coming Wednesday. The word 'Lent' comes from an old English word meaning 'springtime'. Lent reminds us of spring-cleaning in our homes, and the renewal of life in Nature that comes at this time. It is a time to tackle our blind spots, to identify our demons and recognize the illusions and deceptions we have regarding our own relationship with Christ. It should make us more aware of our weaknesses and thereby lead us to genuine self-knowledge. Here is a prayer that we might say often, especially during the season of Lent: 'Lord, grant me the serenity to accept the people I cannot change, the courage to change the person I can change, and the wisdom to know that this person is ME'
