#### EASTER SERVICES FOR HOLY WEEK AT ST. AUGUSTINES AND OUR LADY OF SORROWS, ETON.

The following is the schedule of Services for Holy Week, which begins next Sunday (Palm Sunday).

Palm Sunday Weekend (April 9th/10th): Masses will be at the usual weekend times and will be preceded by Blessing of Palms.

#### THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Lord, there was a time when the feeling of guilt had us paralysed. We felt condemned by voices within us, coming from sermons we had heard in childhood, threatening us with hell fire, teachers telling us we were no good. Like the woman in today's Gospel, we felt as if we were standing in full view of our accusers, and they were condemning us to a hell of self-loathing.

We thank you, Lord, that at that moment we heard the wise and compassionate voice of Your son, telling us through our parents and very special friends of how special and precious we are - that we are 'carved on the palm of Your hands'. Gradually the accusing voices slunk away in defeat as they saw You write on the ground of how passionately You love us and how much each of us means to You.

St. Seraphim once wrote: "all condemnation is of the devil. We condemn others only because we shun condemning ourselves"

It's been about 70 years since I heard my mother quote these memorable words to someone who was saying nasty things about a friend of hers who had died.
