# **EASTER REFLECTION**

The birth of Jesus is obviously a key moment in the history of our salvation. But it is not the climactic moment. It's just the starting-point of a process or journey which has its climax in the Resurrection. The Resurrection doesn't merely testify to the truth that Jesus is risen. It heralds the *empowerment* of Jesus, the releasement of his Power as Second Person of the Trinity. Freed from space-time limitations of this world, Jesus is now with his Father in heaven engaged in the mission of unifying Creation and bringing it back to the Father.

Because we have been 'baptized into Christ', we Christians are co-responsible with Christ in accomplishing his mission. Being a good Christian, then, means far more than believing the truths of our Faith, being a loyal member of the Church and saving our souls. It involves this, of course, but its horizon is far wider. It means collaborating with Christ in his work of transforming the world and bringing it back to the Father.

This is our privileged calling as Christians – and what an especially challenging one it is at the present time, as we see all the evil in the world, especially in Ukraine. But while the evil is there in abundance, we're not, in the least, pessimistic. Indeed, we're full of hope that evil will eventually be conquered. This hope would be just wishful thinking, a utopian dream, were it not for *the presence of the Risen-Christ-in-us*, for whom nothing is impossible. It was this Faith-vision that emboldened Evelyn Underhill to write these inspiring words at the height of the London bombing during World War 11:

'Easter and Pentecost show us ... our Lord himself and his chosen apostles possessed of a <u>new power</u> – the power of the Spirit. That supernatural power is still the inheritance of every Christian. It is this power <u>and only this</u> that can bring in the new Christian society of which we hear so much. (Anthology of Love, 68-70)
