### EASTER REFLECTION

Last week, we said that our call, as Christians, is not to redeem ourselves from the world; it is to *redeem the world*. This entails expanding our traditional notion of evangelization – seeing it as far more than teaching doctrine and the commandments we must obey. It must include opening our minds to the beauty and order in the wonderful world God has given us. It means deepening our appreciation of the huge advances in science and technology that we've seen in recent times, recognizing that the sciences can be a huge ally in our quest for a more human and Christian world. We have seen how many of the discoveries in the scientific field can, if properly managed, greatly enrich our lives, reduce human suffering, facilitate greater communication and make life less lonely for many.

But our appreciation of science and technology mustn't blind us to the evil that is latent in the almostgodlike worship that is given to the sciences at the present time. While technological progress is admirable, it mustn't be achieved at the cost of spiritual values. Promoting spiritual values must remain paramount in any society that aims to further the *true progress* of humanity. These values include compassion, solidarity, generosity, chastity, self-control, selflessness etc. Having them at the forefront of our catechetical programmes is a *key part of evangelization*. This means, among other things, promoting initiatives that will arrest the downward trend towards selfishness and individualism, raise awareness of the huge level of injustice in the world, promote community ventures that help people out of loneliness and depression, raise the dignity of all people. It means protecting and beautifying the environment, creating conditions that will make the world a more human place for people to live in, and a better and safer place for those who come after us.
