THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Faithfulness/Fidelity

Because friendship is such a precious thing it is very fragile. It takes much effort and sacrifice to preserve and nurture it. Frail creatures that we are, it is very easy to let selfishness undermine even the strongest of friendships. An obvious form of selfishness is in using others for my own advantage or satisfaction. A subtle, but far more common form, is the tendency to take another's friendship for granted. I need to be aware of the silent way that routine and boredom can gradually undermine friendship. Remembering birthdays, anniversaries, peak occasions, frequent use of phone calls or social media – all these can be valuable ways of keeping alive the *gifted, sacred nature of friendship,* and preventing it from becoming just a casual or functional relationship.

In virtually every relationship there will be times when the sheer joy of being together will wane and I no longer feel how life-enhancing a true friend is. This is a crisis time, a time when friendship is tested and proven. It's a time when I come to know if a friendship is truly the selfless commitment, I thought it to be, or is there too much of the ego in it.

I need to remember that friendship is *more about commitment than emotion,* more about *Willing than Feeling.* And this applies to all kinds of friendship, including the marital bond. A Steadfast Will gives me the courage and strength to endure the dry periods that frequently affect a relationship. These are periods that test how genuine friendship really is. If I have the resolve and determination to live through these times of darkness, I'll find that friendship can reach a new level and become even stronger. Indeed, it is probably true that friendships can grow *only* through being tested in the everydayness of boredom and routine.
