FOODBANK – A SPECIAL APPEAL: Because of the very difficult times we are in at present, we fear that for very many people, this time leading up to Christmas will be anything but enjoyable, as they struggle to have sufficient money to afford the essentials. We all can help in some little way by being as generous as possible in relieving their anxiety and bringing some little light into their Christmas. The items that are most essential are basics items:

Food (Urgent): Soup, Long-life Fruit Juice, Tinned Meat (stewed steak, mince, chicken in sauce), Sponge Puddings, Tinned Carrots/Mixed Veg.

Toiletries and Basic Items: (Urgent): Deodorants, Disposable Razors, Shampoo, Shower gel/soap.

Thought for the Week - ADVENT

Advent is a time of waiting – waiting for the full revelation of God's love which he shows in the coming to us of his Son. It's a time when we might reflect on the stages God has taken in order to show us how precious we are to him. The first stage of his revelation of love is in the book of Genesis which shows us God as our Creator, drawing us out of nothingness, and giving us a magnificent and beautifully ordered world for our welfare and enjoyment. The second stage is Bethlehem, which brings us to an entirely new level of his love. He is not just a gracious benefactor, living in the remoteness of heaven. He is a God who has a burning desire to be with us. But that is still not enough for this 'tremendous lover' – he wants to go further. He gives his life on the Cross for us and ascends to his Father after his most cruel death in order to prepare a place for us, so that we could be with him, and live with him face to face for all eternity.

But, as we know, love can't be just one-sided; it must be mutual. Because we have the gift of free will, we can either accept or reject God's love. The choice is ours. If we refuse his love, all he can do is stand idly by, with all the grief of a spurned lover. He is grieving not for himself but for us, because we have preferred the illusion to the reality, because we have chosen the passing values and pleasures of this present life to the eternal joy of our homeland in heaven.

Advent is a time for 'waking up' - waking up to the reckless extremes to which an infinitely loving God is willing go in order to show us how deep is his desire that we be with him forever when we leave this world.
