FOODBANK – A SPECIAL APPEAL: Because of the very difficult times we are in at present, we fear that for very many people, this time of Christmas will be anything but enjoyable, as they struggle to have sufficient money to afford the essentials. We can help in some little way by being as generous as possible in relieving their anxiety and bringing some little light into their Christmas. The items that are most essential are basics items. **Food (Urgent):** Soup, Long-life Fruit Juice, Tinned Meat (stewed steak, mince, chicken in sauce), Sponge Puddings, Tinned Carrots/Mixed Veg. **Toiletries and Basic Items: (Urgent):** Deodorants, Disposable Razors, Shampoo, Shower gel/soap. **Always required:** Tinned Fruit, Instant Mash, Instant Coffee (small jars), Tinned Fish, Toothpaste, Washing up liquid, Shaving foam/gel, Baby wipes, Strong Carrier Bags.

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - IN PRAISE OF MARY

Mary, what did God find in you that was so special that he chose you from among all other women to be mother of His Son. Your obedience and your faith must have been prime factors, but so also was your humility.

More than any other creature, you lived the truth of who you were – a mere creature. You were created by God. Your whole being was anchored in this truth – that everything, even your very existence, was a gift from God. Yes, Mary, emptiness or nothingness was your only 'possession', the only gift you could give God. And how much He cherished it. For it was this gift that allowed Him to enter our human condition. Because you were so truthful about your creaturely condition God was free to emerge from the remoteness of His Godhead and enter the body of a creature, assured in the knowledge that, in you, His divinity would not be usurped or compromised. In you, it would be completely safe from our sinful attempts to control God or become like Him, as did Adam and Eve.

For you never tried to possess God or use Him for your own benefit. In your heart there's never a thought of greatness or self-importance – just a continual advance into amazement and gratitude, as you pondered the bewilderingly great thing that 'He who is mighty' had done in you.

Nor was there any attempt to use your privileged position to gain recognition from your friends. There's no suggestion of letting your divine motherhood become a self-conscious thing – something you would use to mark yourself off as different from others, as better than them. No, Mary – the more the temptation to be special grew the more you instinctively returned that truth in which your whole being was grounded – the truth of your creaturehood, that all was gift. It is 'He that is mighty who has done great things in me, holy is His name'.
