At the moment, in addition to the items listed as required below, there is a is very urgent need for bottles of <u>WASHING-UP</u> <u>LIQUID</u> and <u>LONG-LIFE FRUIT JUICE</u>.

In general, the items that are most essential are basics items.

**Food (Urgent):** Soup, Long-life Fruit Juice, Tinned Meat (stewed steak, mince, chicken in sauce), Sponge Puddings, Tinned Carrots/Mixed Veg.

Toiletries and Basic Items: (Urgent): Deodorants, Disposable Razors, Shampoo, Shower gel/soap.

**Always required:** Tinned Fruit, Instant Mash, Instant Coffee (small jars), Tinned Fish, Toothpaste, Washing up liquid, Shaving foam/gel, Baby wipes, Strong Carrier Bags.

**HELP WITH COST OF LIVING?** If you know of anyone needing help because of the Cost of Living crisis you might like to take with you a leaflet from Caritas, the Charity Office in Northampton Diocese. A limited number of leaflets are at the rear of the Church. More copies are available if needed.

### THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Today's readings would have us dwell on the baptism of Jesus as a turning point, the closure of a life hidden in Nazareth and the beginning of a public life announcing the Reign of God. It is fitting, therefore, that there is a public proclamation by the Father of Jesus as beloved Son, together with a visible outpouring of the Holy Spirit. At this moment of transition from hidden life to public life, Jesus is being divinely authorised and divinely vindicated.

What does this Feast of the Baptism of Jesus have to say to you today? Perhaps an invitation to consider significant moments of transition in life – marrying, changing residence or downsizing, parting with loved ones or dealing with unexpected medical diagnosis. For us, as for Jesus, transition can be challenging, but also filled with God's grace. We, too, are beloved of the Father and anointed with the Spirit. This makes all the difference as we negotiate transitions in life

This Feast is also a time for us to reflect on our own baptism as a commissioning, a taking of responsibility to take God more into our lives and live more authentically as his children. It is also a call to do all we can towards eliminating evil in the world and towards building up God's kingdom of justice, of love and of peace.
