### SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME- 18 JANUARY 2026

As we settle into Ordinary Time, today's liturgy bridges the joy of Christmas with the mission of the cross. In the Gospel, John the Baptist looks at Jesus and cries out, "*Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world*" (John 1:29). This is a "bombshell" title. A lamb is not a symbol of earthly power or military might. It is a symbol of vulnerability, docility, and sacrifice. By calling Jesus the "Lamb," John reveals that God's plan to conquer evil is not through force, but through a love so deep it is willing to be consumed. The First Reading from Isaiah reminds us that being God's servant is "too little" if it is only for ourselves. We are called to be a "light to the nations." Like John, our job is to point others to Christ. We do this when we choose humility over pride and service over prestige. Today, as you hear the words "*Behold the Lamb of God*" before Communion, ask yourself: Do I recognize Him in the challenging person or the quiet moment? May we have the "poverty of heart" to see Him and the courage to follow where He leads.

**WEEK OF CHRISTIAN UNITY:** The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (WPCU) takes place each year from 18 to 25 January. This ecumenical celebration provides an opportunity to focus our prayers on Christian unity and to know that we are joining with international siblings in Christ. WPCU is also a great chance to speak about and experience Christian unity personally, in your village, town or county. This year WPCU takes Ephesians 4 v 1-13 as its central text which includes the words "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling." (Ephesians 4:4).

Food: long life fruit juice, tinned fruit, tinned tuna, tinned vegetables, long life custard, pasta sauces (long life), coffee, long-life milk, soup (tinned), long-life rice pudding, tea, long life sponge puddings, tinned tomatoes, tinned meat, chapati flour 2kg size, oil 1 litre size, jam and biscuits.

Please note they have a 12 month supply of PASTA. It is NOT NEEDED.

Toiletries & Basic Items: washing up liquid, shampoo, deodorant, shaving foam/gel, sanitary pads, toothpaste, child toothbrushes, nappies size 7 & 8.

Always required: soap, toilet rolls, strong carrier bags.
