### FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – 08 FEBRUARY 2026

In today's Gospel from Mark, we witness the beginning of Jesus' public ministry in Capernaum. The people in the synagogue are "astonished," not just by his words, but by the authority with which he speaks. Unlike the scribes, who relied on quoting past traditions, Jesus speaks as the very source of Truth. This authority is not a heavy-handed power used to control, but a liberating power used to heal. When Jesus encounters the man with the unclean spirit, he does not engage in a long debate. With a command—"Quiet! Come out of him!"—the man is set free. As we look toward 2026, many of us feel weighed down by "unclean spirits" of our own: anxiety, resentment, or the noise of a world that feels increasingly chaotic. We often look for authority in politics, social media, or self-help. Yet, today's liturgy reminds us that true authority belongs to Christ alone. He speaks to the storms in our hearts with the same command: "Quiet." He invites us to surrender our burdens to his sovereign care. Let us ask ourselves today: What "spirit" is holding me back from God, and am I ready to let Jesus' authoritative word set me free?...Fr. Shyju

**SUPPORT THE FOODBANK:** Boxes for donations can be found in each Church. The items on their Shopping List are:

Food: long life fruit juice, tinned fruit, tinned tuna, tinned vegetables, long life custard, pasta sauces (long life), coffee, long-life milk, soup (tinned), long-life rice pudding, tea, long life sponge puddings, tinned tomatoes, tinned meat, chapati flour 2kg size, oil 1 litre size, jam and biscuits.

Please note they have a 12 month supply of PASTA. It is NOT NEEDED.

Toiletries & Basic Items: washing up liquid, shampoo, deodorant, shaving foam/gel, sanitary pads, toothpaste, child toothbrushes, nappies size 7 & 8.

Always required: soap, toilet rolls, strong carrier bags.
